SOFT CRATES

The Royal Kennel Club has asked that we draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside. We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave your dogs unattended, either in the hall, or in an open car in the car park.

Introducing your Dog Judge – Lee Rhodes (Teracota)

I was born and reared in a household where a Staffordshire Bull Terrier was considered part of the family, being fortunate that my father had been an enthusiast of the breed for many years. I have never lived in a house without a Stafford. Living in Cradley, I was lucky enough to meet a few of the "old boys", who were there at the start of breed recognition. I first started attending shows with my father in the early 70's. I became an active member of the SBTC in 1978 and was Vice Chairman for quite a few years. I have bred several litters, which have included a number of show winners at all levels of competition. The most successful being Rustic Charm at Teracota, Teracota Odd Job, Teracota Phil's Pet, Teracota The Heathen (Best Puppy, Terrier Group, Darlington Ch Show) & Teracota Hells Angel. Most recently I have been showing my Champion Taraiel Reaper at Teracota, handling him to Champion status. He was also the UK's top SBT Puppy 2018. Progeny of my breeding can be found in Australia, Africa, Canada, several European countries and the USA, where Teracota Red Jack is an American Champion. In 1988, I obtained the Canine Studies Institute Judging Diploma and began judging the same year. I awarded Challenge Certificates for the first time in 2001 and have done so on a regular basis ever since.



Introducing your Bitch Judge - Andy Land (Winzack)



I got my first Stafford in 1993, a top sized red boy and we began showing. A year later we purchased our first bitch Goldstone Dancing Queen At Winzack, she achieved 1CC and produced Winzack Lets Get It On who got his SBN. I was in co-ownership with Sebsonic Demarkos Pearl who also gained 1CC. Bullhawk Mol Flanders At Winzack was shown lightly with 1CC also. When the sad day came to say goodbye to our two oldies, it was time to start again and we found a cracking red bitch pup from sporting and show lines Zivannaz No Stopping Me Now At Winzack who went on to gain her Champion title. She was mated to Dringshaw Masterpiece and the result was 6 cracking pups in which Winzack Parker Junior & Scrumpy Jack will now be shown. I served on Downlands committee for 14 years, I've been fortunate to have judged overseas in Sweden, Australia, New Zealand and honoured to have judged the EDS last year in the Czech Rep.

This will be my 6th appointment at this level in the UK. Many thanks go to the WSBTC for the appointment of which I am a committee member and Vice Chairman among a hard working & honest team.

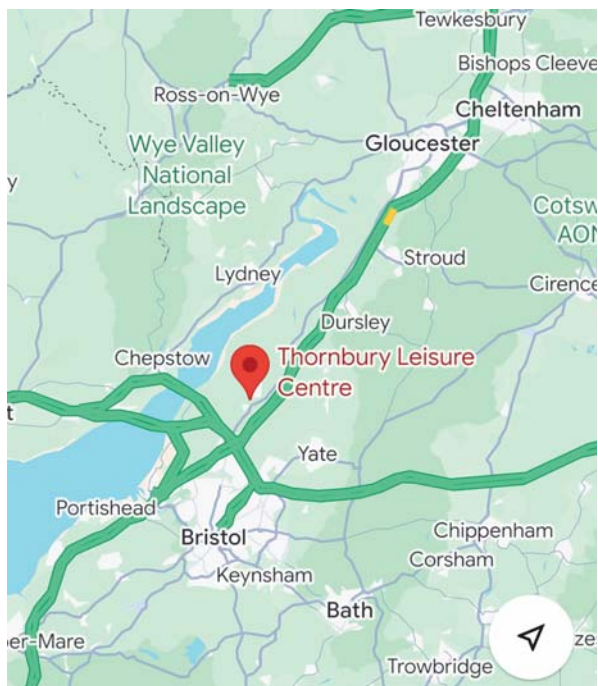

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE

From the North: Head south-west on M5. At junction 14 exit towards Thornbury. Turn right onto B4509 then turn left onto A38. Turn right onto Grovesend Road. At the roundabout, take the 1st exit onto Midland Way. Go through one roundabout and take the 2nd exit off the next roundabout. Turn left onto Bristol Road/B4061. After 0.3 miles, turn left and you will arrive at Thornbury Leisure Centre.

From the South: Head north-east on M5. At junction 16, take the A38 exit to Thornbury/Filton. At Almondsbury roundabout, take the 1st exit onto Gloucester Road/A38. After 3.6 miles turn left onto Thornbury Road/B4061. After 0.9 miles, turn right and you will arrive at Thornbury Leisure Centre.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday 18th July 2026**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Minor Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

Junior: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

Yearling: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

Novice: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Post Graduate: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Limit: For dogs which have not become show Champions under The Royal Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Open: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

Veteran: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show.

Good Citizen Dog Scheme Class: For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze Award Certificate or above.

Not For Competition: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 9.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **Entry Fees:** Members first entry £15.00 per dog. Non-Members first entry £17.00 per dog. All subsequent entries with the same dog £3.00. Veterans £1.00 per dog. Not for Competition entries £2.00. Class Sponsorship £5.00. Membership fees: £7.00 single, £9.50 joint, £10.00 Overseas. You may enter online at www.highampress.co.uk.
6. **Prize Money:** There is no prize money on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show (if scheduled).** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition.
11. **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Royal Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Royal Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Royal Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and The Royal Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Royal Kennel Club licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Royal Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Royal Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under The Royal Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Royal Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. **Not For Competition:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Royal Kennel Club registered. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 3 calendar months of age on the first day of the show.
19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of The Royal Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.
21. **CANCELLATION OR ABANDONMENT.** Entry fees will not be refunded in any circumstances where any Act of God or any other unforeseen reason causes the cancellation or abandonment of the show.
22. The show will be held under Royal Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only those entries are received.
23. The Committee of this show cannot be held responsible for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show, and remind exhibitors that such products may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
24. Exhibitors/handlers are responsible for clearing up and removing any loose hair or fouling from dogs in their charge, or any other litter, whether from the car park, the exercise area or from any other part of the venue.
25. Parents/Guardians please note, well behaved children are welcome but those in charge of children will be held fully responsible for their actions and any damage caused within the environs of the show.
26. Owners, handlers, exhibitors or any other person in charge of a dog at a Royal Kennel Club licensed event must ensure at all times that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, car parks and approaches.
27. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency.
28. Passes will not be sent.
29. Exhibitors are required to display exhibit/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times when attending shows.

Dog Fouling F13 (a)

Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste at any Royal Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. The Society will arrange for the dispersal of suitable receptacles to assist compliance with regulation F13 (b).
